Role summary

An exciting opportunity has arisen for a Recovery Support Volunteer to join our Scunthorpe team. As a Recovery Support Volunteer you will be working alongside recovery workers to help engage and support clients making positive choices and changes in their lives, gaining experience in the substance misuse field and undertaking comprehensive training as you progress.

As part of the team you will provide support to our clients, helping them work towards their goals to cut down their drug or alcohol use. Volunteers may work in a 1-1 or group based setting with clients, helping them to take a holistic approach to their recovery journey.

What will you be doing?

Group Work

- Supporting the Group Work Facilitator to deliver group sessions(s).
- Participating in debriefs after groups, to share any reflections or concerns about group discussions.
- Supporting staff with the preparation, planning & co-production of new groups.

1-1 Client Support and Outreach

- Supporting the needle syringe provision
- Accompany staff who are visiting clients in the community or on home visits.

- Sitting in on client sessions with a member of staff (where appropriate) to provide support & advice.
- Perform recovery check-ins for those nearing the end of their treatment pathways.
- Providing accurate and timely notes to be input onto the case management system.
- Actively promoting and being part of developing recovery activities and community events.

Events

- Supporting staff in providing information on drug and alcohol use and treatment to the general public at community events.
- Helping to plan and organise events to promote our services.

What skills and abilities do you need?

- A friendly, positive and approachable manner.
- Ability to work with people in a non-judgmental and solution-focused way.
- Able to work independently and as part of a diverse team.
- Ability to empathise the challenges faced by the people using our services.
- Able to follow instructions and act on own initiative within set boundaries.
- IT literacy; previous experience of data entry and working on recording systems may be helpful.
- Good command of the English Language both verbally and in writing.
- Ability to respect and maintain confidentiality.
